# Washing Cars

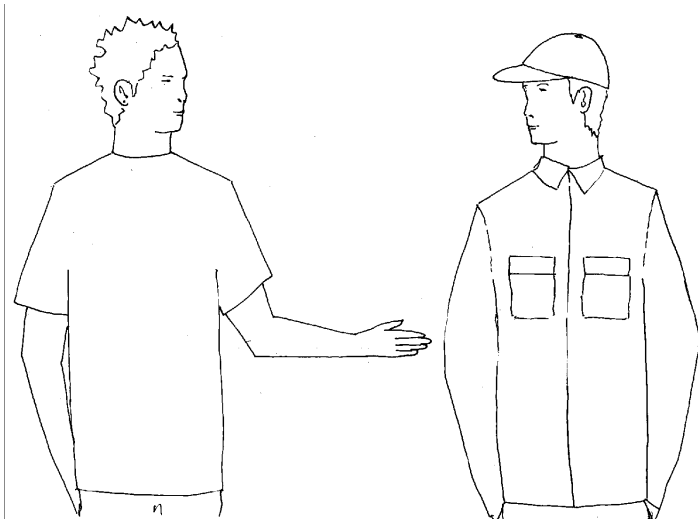

Brian and Simon agreed to work together and clean cars for pocket money. They both got a bucket, a sponge and a cloth from home.



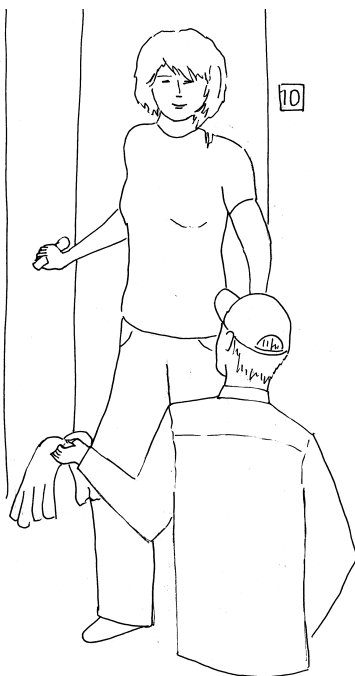

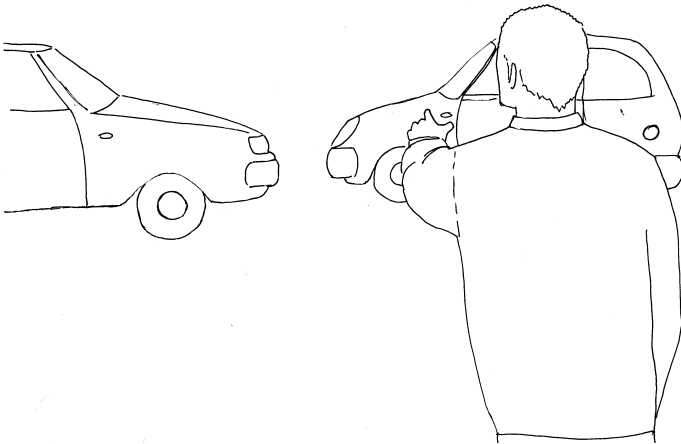
Simon went to number 8 and knocked. No one was there. Brian tried number 10 and a woman opened the door.

The woman said, "Sorry. No thank you."

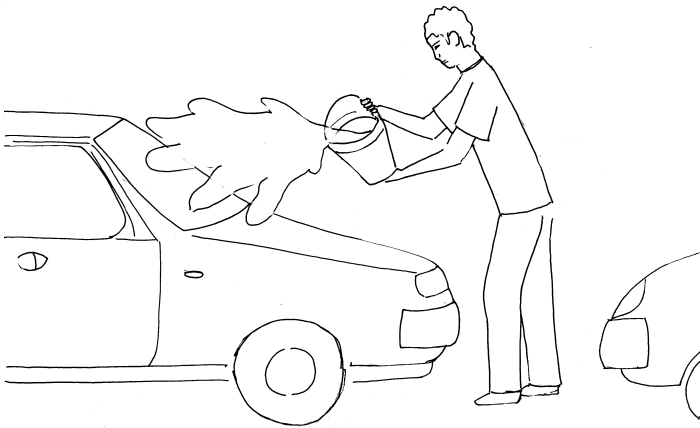

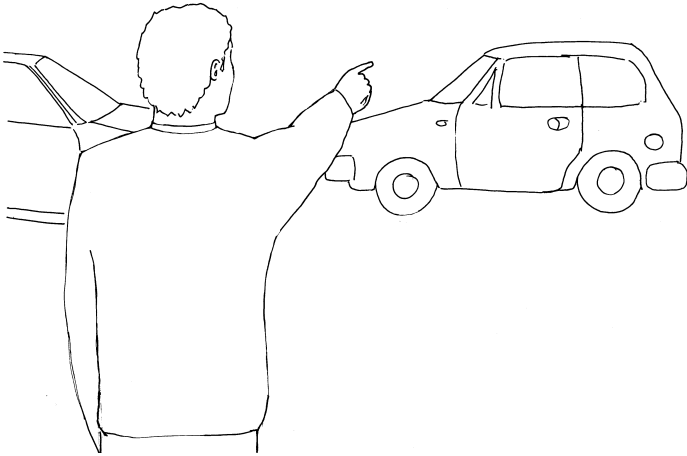
Then they used their cloths to dry the car. Now it was clean and sparkling. Brian said, "Now it is finished. I will go and tell the man we have cleaned his car."



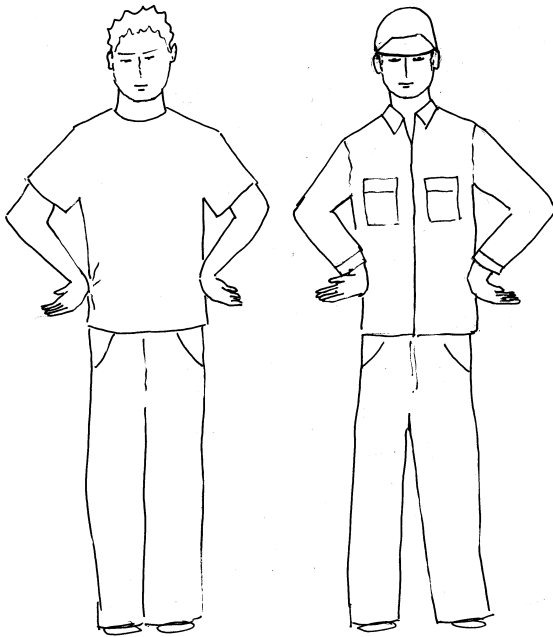
Brian knocked and the man came out. He followed Brian down the drive. When they got to the car, the man laughed and you know what he said?

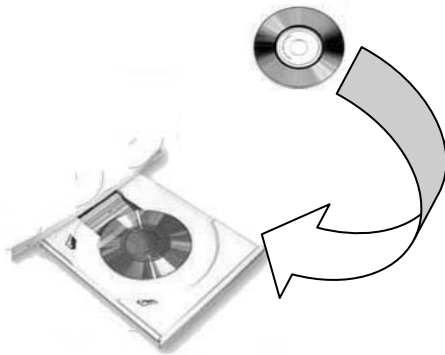
When the CD is loaded, it should autorun.
