Double Click



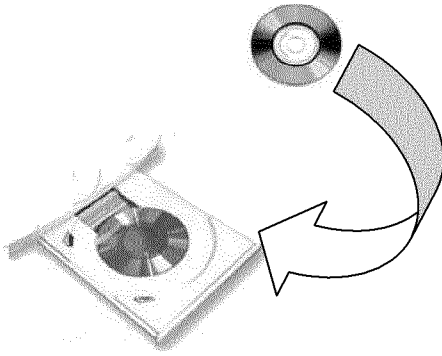
